Counting Each Person: The Mitzvah of Donating Half a Shekel

Facilitator Guide

What is the biblical commandment of donating half a shekel, connecting with the month of Adar? How can we use the values behind this mitzvah to illustrate the importance that each and every person contribute to bringing the hostages home?

FRAMING THE ISSUE

There is a commandment in the Torah which calls on every person over the age of 20 to contribute a halfshekel to the community. This commandment is read in synagogues today during the regular Torah reading cycle, with an additional reading that highlights this commandment on the Shabbat leading into the month of Adar (or Adar Bet during a leap year). How can we use the values behind this mitzvah to illustrate the importance that each and every person contribute to bringing the hostages home?

LET'S EXPLORE

This session is a text-based learning and discussion. It can be facilitated as a full group, with the facilitator inviting participants to take turns reading the sources aloud and guiding participants through the discussion questions on the source sheet, or it can be a guided hevruta/ paired learning, with the discussion happening in pairs or small groups. The facilitator can adapt, based on what best fits with their learners.


Tie-In Dates:

TAKE ACTION!

In honor of Ta'anit Esther and the mitzvah of *machatzit hashekel*, donating half a shekel, invite participants to donate at least \$8 (the recommended amount for machatzit hashekel today) to the <u>Bring Hersh Home campaign</u> or to the <u>Hostages and Missing Families Forum</u> and encourage others in your community to participate. When you donate the money, state the intention that you are giving this money for the return of the hostages.

CLOSING INTENTION

Remind participants that just as each member of Bnei Israel was accountable for *machatzit hashekel*, we all share in the responsibility to bring the hostages home. Each one of us counts. Each one of them counts.


